Different trainings under State Budget-2021-22

NSTIAM completed the last phase of the 2-week virtual training programs on "Post-Harvest Management, Preservation and Marketing of Fruits & Vegetables" during the month of January'22. Total **38 trainees from 02 FPCs**, as nominated by Suliguri RMC and Jalpaiguri ZRMC attended the program from their residence through their smartphones.

The Institute also completed the allotted online e-NAM training for the **e-NAM** Stakeholders during this quarter. 28 Progressive stakeholders, representing farmers, FPO/FPC members & traders were trained through 02 **number of 2-day online training** in the month of January'22.







Different trainings sponsored by NIAM, Jaipur

The Institute organized **07 numbers of 3-day training** program sponsored by **National Institute of Agricultural Marketing (NIAM) Jaipur** on "Value Addition to Agricultural Produces" and "FPO linkage with Extension, Credit, Infrastructure, Value Addition and Marketing" for Farm Women and Board of Directors of different FPCs of the State respectively through offline mode.

Total **71 Farm women** from Paschim Burdwan, Hooghly, Nadia and 24 Parganas (N) district participated in **04 trainings** on Value Addition held during **February and March'22**.

51 Board of Directors from total 27 FPCs (03 FPCs each from 09 districts) took part in the 2nd type of training on FPO linkage with Extension, Credit, Infrastructure, Value Addition and Marketing. Knowledge on various topics such as Basics of Project Planning and Management, Agriculture Infrastructure Fund, Value addition of Agri produce, low-cost Packaging of Food Items etc. were imparted to the trainees along with **hands-on practical in the Demo Lab** of NSTIAM.

One-day workshop with trainees

NSTIAM conducted a one-day **Workshop** cum One-time Financial Assistance (OTA) Distribution ceremony for the Trainee groups of NSTIAM under 02 weeks training on 'Post Harvest Management, Preservation and Marketing of Fruits and Vegetables' conducted during the F.Y 2021-22 at the Conference Hall of NSTIAM **on 16-03-2022.**

Apart from **21** participants from **07** FPCs; Chief Executive Officer, West Bengal State Agricultural Marketing Board; Officer on Special Duty & Ex-officio Special Secretary, Agricultural Marketing Department and **Managing Director**, Paschimbanga Agri Marketing Corporation Limited were among the eminent guests who delivered their valuable suggestions and visions to the participants. The workshop concluded by distribution of OTA to 07 FPCs as a part of their post-Training Assistance.
